Discriminatory immigration laws, detention and family separation policies, and worsening human rights conditions makes the US an inhospitable environment for an international AIDS conference in 2020. Additionally, legal travel restrictions imposed by the U.S. on sex workers and people who use drugs, make it very difficult for members of these communities, which are disproportionately affected by HIV, to enter the country.

GOALS

Provide a safe alternative for individuals who are unable, or unwilling enter the U.S. in 2020 or who cannot afford to attend the International AIDS Conference.

Reaffirm the leading role communities play in the global HIV response.

In an extraordinary show of solidarity, an international group of people living with HIV, gay and bisexual men, people who use drugs, sex workers, transgender people, youth, and indigenous advocates are collaboratively organizing HIV2020, which will be specifically tailored to the needs of frontline community members.

HIV2020 will place in **Mexico City, July 5-7, 2020**, and will run concurrently with the first half of the international AIDS conference.

THEMES

- Unacceptably high HIV incidence in key populations.
- Criminalization, stigma, discrimination, and violence.
- Access to quality HIV treatment and health services.
- Community and key population-led programs.
- Investing in community- led responses to HIV.
- Intersectionality and diversity within our communities.
- Linking HIV with broader health, social justice, and human rights movements.

ATTENDEES

2,000 community advocates, scientists, clinicians, program implementers, policy makers and funders.

STRUCTURE

<u>Day 1</u> will provide opportunities for AFFINITY - thematic caucuses, and spaces for professional groups, networks, national and regional advocates to gather and to have 'in-house' discussions.

<u>Day 2</u> will underscore INTERSECTIONALITY in the HIV response and will be organized as a series of concurrently-run, all-day programs, including scientific and thematic programs, training academies, and opportunities to examine successful community-led programs.

<u>Day 3</u> will focus on **SOLIDARITY** - bringing together affinity groups and discussions about intersectional responses to HIV. This day will feature plenary keynote addresses and panel discussions.

HIV2020 participants will be asked to contribute to a global action plan for solidifying community's role in the HIV and related global health movements.



SPONSORSHIP TIERS

(named for community gathering spaces)

Funding support for HIV2020 will be acknowledged on all event-related collateral materials. Level of support and additional sponsorship benefits described below:

Plaza - \$200,000 or more

Invitation to offer remarks at one of our plenary sessions; full-page program book ad with priority placement; branding with logo on all HIV2020 collateral; waived registration fees for up to 10 HIV2020 participants; and event space naming privileges.

Sponsorship at the Plaza level could support 100 partial and full scholarships <u>OR</u> nearly all venue-related costs.

Agora - \$100,000 - \$199,999

Sponsorship at the Agora level could support up to 65 full scholarships <u>OR</u> all collateral materials and photography/videography/media engagement.

Circle - \$10,000 - \$49,999

Square - less than \$10,000


